The Local Government Act 1972 s101 Arrangements for discharge of functions by local authorities states:

"Subject to any express provision contained in this Act or any Act passed after this Act, a local authority may arrange for the discharge of any of their functions by a committee, a sub-committee or an officer of the authority"

This does not include issuing of the precept, which must be a Council decision.

For Members information, a number of local parish councils, including Clayton-le-Woods, Coppull, Euxton, Whittle-le-Woods, operate an appointed committee system with devolved powers.

Chorley Council's revised Action on Requests for Tree Works are as follows:

Dangerous Trees	Made safe within 48 hours		
Non-Urgent Requests	Scheduled based on available budgets.		
Overhanging Branches	As a good neighbour, the Council will investigate overhanging branches from Council-owned trees on a case-by-case basis and where:		
	A branch poses an unacceptable risk to people or property		
	Branches are in physical contact with a structure (e.g., rubbing against roofs/ gutters).		
	The work is beyond the reasonable maintenance means of the property owner that is causing an issue (e.g., large/ high branches).		
Trees Blocking Light	The Council does not prune or fell trees solely to improve natural light to private properties. However, action may be taken if:		
	Light restriction is severely impacting other Council-managed trees or vegetation		
	There is evidence of a significant detriment to a private property		
	'Significant' is assessed case-by-case, considering factors like property use, duration of issue, and environmental balance.		
TV/Satellite Reception	The Council will not trim or remove trees to improve TV or satellite signal.		
Solar Panels	The Council will not trim or remove trees to improve sunlight to solar panels.		
Seasonal Debris	The Council will not trim or remove trees to reduce leaf fall, fruit, or other debris. Exceptions may be made in cases of anti-social behaviour.		
Large/Tall Trees	The Council will not trim or remove trees solely because they are large or tall.		
Tree Roots	The Council will not trim or remove trees to prevent root spread into gardens.  Property owners may trim roots back to the boundary but must ensure this does not harm the tree. If the tree is harmed, the owner may be liable.		
Private Funding for Works to Council-Owned Trees	The Council will not accept private funding for tree works. Private individuals or companies do not have the right to undertake tree works on Council land.

## 83.25 Public Participation

Resident of Newlands complained about trees on the Millennium Green shading a garden. This was referred to the Open Spaces Committee.

Representatives from the Eccleston Institute advised the facility, having been in existence for over 100 years, is facing financial difficulties and queried whether the Parish Council might be able to assist. The status of the institute as a members club was clarified. As the request related to possible improvements to the facilities to encourage additional customers, the representatives were asked to submit details of any improvement projects the Parish Council might be able to consider assistance for. Once these details have been provided, an item will be included on the agenda for a future meeting

### 84.25 Planning Matters

25/00530/CLPUD Application for a certificate of lawfulness for the use of a (Use Class C3a) dwelling house as a children's home for a maximum of two children (up to 18 years in age), with 24hr care provided by not more than two carers on site, working on a shift basis, and a Manager present 09:00 to 17:00 up to five days a week (Use Class C2) at Brook View, Preston Nook

25/00534/FUL Change of use of land to domestic garden (retrospective) at 45 New Street

There were no objections to these applications.

25/00577/OUTMAJ Outline planning application (with all matters reserved save for the principal means of access) for a residential development of up to 350 homes (Use Class C3) and a 186.9 sqm (2,012 sqft) community hub (Use Classes C3, E and F), with associated habitat creation, landscaping, open space, parking, footpaths/cycleways, drainage and other infrastructure at Camelot Theme Park, Park Hall Road, Charnock Richard. Concerns were raised regarding the impact of the suggested number of proposed vehicle movements on the suitability of the vehicular access onto Park Hall Road and impact on local infrastructure and services.

Resolved: an objection, on the grounds of the inadequacy of the proposed access, is to be submitted.

#### 85.25 Financial Matters

i) The financial monitoring statement was considered.

Resolved: the monitoring statement was received and accepted and signed by the Chairman.

ii) A suggestion to contribute towards a memorial for a former St Mary's Primary School pupil was considered.

Resolved: a contribution of £250.00 was awarded agreed.

- iii) A request, from a member of the Friends of Eccleston Primary School, for a contribution towards the costs of replacement of an existing playground structure and provision of a garden area aimed at children with additional sensory needs was considered. The applicant advised the school has no budget for this work. Concerns were raised regarding the costs of the proposed work and lack of provision of quotations. A meeting is to be arranged with the School to discuss the request further.
- iv) A request from Heskin Parish Council for a contribution towards the costs of an independent Planning Consultant to formulate an objection to the Camelot Theme Park planning application was considered

Resolved: a contribution of £100.00 was awarded, to be paid when required.

#### Dear Sir

We have recently been made aware of some money which has been bequeathed to the village, a proportion of which may be available to sports clubs within the village, and therefore, hopefully the Cricket Club.

In previous correspondence and discussions with the PC, I have outlined some of the projects which the Cricket Club are looking to fund, and I expanded on this recently when (with Cllr Whittaker's support) seeking CIL funding from Chorley Council with regard to the Redrow development on Doctors Lane. These are:

- a) A new practice net facility to replace our existing artificial practice track ~ £35k to £40k. The existing track has been in place since we moved to the field in 1996 and is no longer fit for purpose.
- b) A new outfield mower ~ £12k. Though our current mower has served us well, the annual servicing and repair bill is increasing year on year as the mower gets older. (Note, we currently have 4 different mowers, each for a different purpose).
- c) An overhaul of our drainage system for the field ~ £5k. Over the course of the past 20 years, the bottom end of the field has become prone to flooding. We need to review what is causing the problem, and incorporate further drainage if necessary.

We are of course pursuing our own fund-raising activities for these projects (just as we did for the recent purchase of new sight-screens, covers, digital scoreboard and replacing the pavilion facias and guttering, when we got assistance from the Lancs Council LCSF - Lancs Culture & Sport Fund - crowdfunding initiative) as well as a generous donation from the Parish Council. However, it seems there is always "the next thing" which needs to be funded, and so any contribution the Parish Council is able to offer would be very gratefully received, and put to very good use.

With 2 senior teams and 4 junior teams, the club is a fundamental hub of our community, as evidenced on any Friday evening when we host our All Stars and Dynamo programmes (age 5 to 11) and the field is full of 80 kids, their parents and grandparents, all making use of our facilities (as evidenced by the photos below).

We take our responsibility to the continuing development of the club for the benefit of the next generation of Eccleston cricketers very seriously, and will always make every effort to continue to improve the facilities we have at the cricket club.

If the PC would like the club to make representation to a future PC meeting, then we'd be happy to oblige. In the email relating to this letter, I've cc'd in our Chairman, President/Treasurer and Director of Cricket/1st XI Captain, who would all be happy to attend a meeting and explain our plans.

Many thanks, in anticipation of your ongoing support.
