Hawthorns Play Area

The refurbishment of the small children's play area is finally complete!

Old items of items of play equipment have been replaced with cradle swings, a seesaw and spring dog and frog. The safety surfacing and seats have also been replaced.

Decals to encourage play have been painted along the path, with a section of the path through the middle of the area being replaced to allow it to be used for play.
